### Officer & Committee Chair Reports: \*

Announcements from Brehan King and Emmie Cardella clarifying role of reps as liaisons between their schools and SPC, reminder for member school dues of \$80, reps needed at Arcadia, Redfield, Kiva and Tavan.

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### Guest speakers: \*

Dr Chestnut Bullying/cyber bullying is defined as aggressive and systematic abuse of power with a desire to hurt. It involves a power imbalance, is repeated over time, and the victim feels helpless to stop it. SUSD employees are required to report it SUSD policy is based on State and Federal law For schools, prevention is key Principals are responsible for encouraging a positive climate and school culture by implementing PBIS PBIS is the framework used to create a positive school culture by emphasizing recognition and encouragement of positive behaviors Administration is provided a notice of anti-bullying policies and procedures when a case of bullying is reported The "Bullying Incident Complaint/Harassment Report Form" May be found on the SUSD website. Any witness may report bullying incidents. Shannon Cronn PBIS uses a 3 tiered model of prevention and intervention. Tier 1 is school wide and includes recognizing positive behaviors and teaching/modeling the behaviors we want to see. Tier 2 is directed at students requiring support and may include peer mediation, restorative justice, direct instruction. Tier 3 is for students requiring more intensive support and may involve connecting families to community resources. Research says the best way to reduce bullying in schools is to address the emotional needs of students through PBIS, establish the positive behaviors we want to see in our schools and have teachers and staff teach/model/reinforce these behaviors with students. Yidera Flores Provided overview of Mohave MS's program Purpose of program is to provide safe, predictable, and effective learning environment for students to be successful Peer attention reinforces bullying, so Mohave's bullying curriculum focuses on teaching prevention behaviors and bystander interruption. Mohave uses a "Stop, Walk, Talk" response program for its students, teaches students to recognize and interrupt bullying behaviors and report to an adult when needed. Mohave asks students to take a pledge, write a personal support plan, and work on ongoing lessons including student forums, practice sessions, etc Staff training is an important component so that PBIS is implemented consistently. Dr Kriekard's announcements The SUSD governing board has approved Kiva Elementary as the next district rebuild. Navajo is currently undergoing its rebuild and will move back into their home campus once completed. District has just launched a 60 day anti-vaping campaign as part of the "National Smoke Out" campaign. District data shows that for SUSD students vaping is more prevalent than smoking.
