- Reviewed AZ's anti bullying statutes (ARS Section 15-341) which enumerate what school districts are required to included in their anti bullying policies.
- Reviewed SUSD's anti bullying policy, JICK 3200 https://www.susd.org/site/handlers/filedownload.ashx?

- Created an anti bullying awareness flyer with SUSD approval that will be posted in every school's front office.
- Met with a representative from GLSEN and went through the organization's
 Model Local Education Agency Bullying and Harassment Prevention Policy

SUSD AND BULLYING AWARENESS

SUSD IS COMMITED TO THE DISSEMINATION OF "BULLYING" INFORMATION TO STUDENTS AND PARENTS/GUARDIANS DURING THE FIRST WEEK OF EACH SCHOOL YEAR.

In addition:

- SUSD provides information to each incoming student during the school year at the time of registration
- Information is posted in each classroom and in common areas of all schools with site contact information included; and
- There is a summary and reinforcement of the district bullying policy in the student handbook and on the district/school website

ARIZONA LAW CONTAINS MANY REQUIREMENTS CONCERNING HOW SUSD MUST ADDRESS BULLYING IN OUR SCHOOLS:

- Staff is required to immediately notify administration of any report or concern of bullying (followed by written report in 1 day)
- Notice of rights, protections and support services are offered to victim
- Timeframe for investigation is shared with victim's parents
- Notice of findings (regardless of outcome) is shared with victim's parents
