Did you know... we have a warehouse of curriculum materials?

Did you know... we have children in **all** our schools who do not speak English as their first language.

- There are currently 50 different languages represented in SUSD
- The number of English Learners (ELs) has increased by 19% from the 2020-2021 school year

Did you know... we have a Critter Farm!

One way SUSD teachers provide hands-on experiences for Life Science standards is through our Critter Farm! These critters engage student learning across multiple grades and core ideas. Here are just a few core ideas supported with investigations involving critters:

- life cycles
- genetics
- cell division
- reproduction
- mutations
- genetic variation
- how organisms obtain resources to survive
- how different organism react to stimuli

- cycling of energy and matter through an ecosystem characteristics of living vs. non-living things interdependence of organisms and their environment
- structures and functions of body parts for survival

Did you know... SUSD offers a variety of programs for gifted students.

- Cluster Grouping in grade K-5 establishes a base level of support for <u>all</u> gifted identified learners.
- Accelerated Math programs in grades 3-7 provides students with rigorous opportunities to apply mathematical understanding, allowing students to access higher level mathematics courses in high school.
- Integrated Reading programs in grades 4 and 5 provides increased exposure to advanced vocabulary, complex text and complex learning opportunities that foster students' literary skill set.
- Multiage Comprehensive Gifted Programs are offered at Kiva, Redfield and Tavan. The
 multiage CGP classroom is designed for highly gifted learners that need a more rapid pace,
 with the opportunity for radical acceleration, as well as the enrichment opportunities.
- Comprehensive Gifted Programs offered at Hopi, Desert Canyon, Ingleside and Mohave foster thematic interdisciplinary studies, academic rigor, critical and creative thinking, and acceleration.
- Continuous training, professional development, and SUSD's Gifted Endorsement Cohort ensures gifted educators are able to develop and refine their skills working with gifted learners.

Did you know.... We offer Mandarin, Japanese, French, and Spanish

- 128 students received the Seal of Biliteracy in 2021 representing all High School campuses and all 4 languages. The Seal of Biliteracy represents proficiency in 2 or more languages.
- The main goal of World Languages is to be able to communicate in the target language.
- We use the STAMP test to assess proficiency in level 4 of all languages.
- In the 2019-2020 school year the district adopted new materials for all four languages.









Did you know... we have an in-house translation department.

During the 2020-2021 school year they completed:


 266 interpretations for school related events such as: parent teacher conferences, IEP's/MET, Town Halls etc.


