Title | Purpose:

Annual Budget for Title I Grant: \$2,545,230

80% - goes directly to support our schools

20% - Indirect Costs to staff and manage programs

Beyond Move On When Reading:

It is the Scottsdale Unified School District Title I department commitment to:

- ☐ Ensure all students are reading at grade level by the end of 3rd grade
- Provide ongoing **Progress Monitoring** for students who have shown difficulty in reading through 5th grade then transitioning to 6th and again to High School so that no students fall through the cracks. (grades 1-12)
- Title I Instructional Specialists at each school serve as "**Reading Case Workers**" ensuring students in the program continue to make progress and identifying new students for the program.

Based on the belief: Students <u>LEARN TO READ</u> from kindergarten to third grade. From third grade and for the rest of their lives... they READ TO LEARN!





Program Components (ESTEAM)

Innovative Minds

- * Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math Camps
- * All-inclusive STEM kits and training purchased through Title 1 in partnership with the 21st Century Learning Center school programs
- * Beginning 2022 all Title I 2nd-5th grade students will have access to 2-3 STEM camps per year using the Innovative Minds Kits after school, before school, during breaks, or during the summer based on their school's 21st CCLC schedule
- * Future kits will include opportunities for middle school students and eventually high school supports as well

Arts Camps

- * In July 2021 we began our 1st arts camp working closely with our SUSD district Arts Coordinator, focused on Band bringing together our Elementary, Middle, and High School band teachers to work with students in an intensive 2 week program
- * Future camps will expand into other performing and visual arts at all grade levels
