**Q & A with Dr. Menzel, SUSD Superintendent –** Dr. Menzel answered questions submitted in person for 15 minutes

**Update with Margaret Serna, SUSD Executive Director of Title 1 -** Ms. Serna introduced herself and gave an overview of Title 1 programming and funding in SUSD.

- Title 1 monies are federal monies to help students living under the poverty line, but these funds impact all SUSD students
  - Many services funded with Title 1 monies are mandated by the state, so losing these federal funds means other funding sources, like M&O funds, will have to be used
- Currently 16% of SUSD qualify for free and reduced lunch, down from 26% a few years ago
- Possible reasons for the decrease in students qualifying for free and reduced lunch are:
  - housing affordability
  - o enrollment decreases
  - identification: breakfast, lunch free for everyone with covid relief funds, so families might not have filled out applications
- Purpose of Title 1:
  - o equity for all children; every child should have equal opportunity
  - Ensure high quality education and ensure proficiency on state academic standards
  - Title 1 funds supplement student academic programs and services
  - Help families connect to school to receive nutritional and social emotional services
  - Increase family engagement
- Title 1 funding challenges
  - \$2,545,230 budget total
  - 80% goes directly to schools, 20% covers staff and management of programs
  - Decrease in number of students who qualify for free and reduced lunch translates to possible loss of 800K+ in federal funding each year

- There are 9 SUSD Title 1 schools: Coronado HS, Ingleside MS, Echo Canyon K-8, Tonolea K-8, Pima ES, Tavan ES, Hohokam ES, Yavapai ES, Navajo ES
- "Beyond" Move On When Reading
  - State of Arizona mandates that 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students not proficient in reading cannot advance
  - Started Progress Monitoring program for students enrolled in Beyond Move On when reading program began, progress now monitored from 1<sup>st</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> grade
  - Reading Case Workers: Title 1 Instructional Specialists who work one-on-one with students in 12-hour program
- Recent SUSD Title 1 programs and events:
  - Elementary schools Innovative Minds Science Kits (similar to Camp Invention)
  - Coronado HS Minds in Motion Celebration
  - Ingleside MS Parenting classes: parents can earn GEDs, learn financial information, parenting skills
  - Tonalea School Pride Nights
  - Echo Canyon Chefs in the Garden program
  - o Ingleside/Tonalea Summer Fine Arts Band Camp
  - Navajo ES Steam Showcase
  - Pima ES Math and Literacy Nights
  - Hohokam/Yavapai Nest Parent education classes
  - Programs and events open to all SUSD families
- Equity access to Science Technology Engineering Arts and Math (ESTEAM)
  - Innovative Minds Science Kits
  - STEAM kits based on what is on AIMS science test
  - Arts camps
  - Tonalea and Ingleside band camp
- \*ALL\* SUSD parents and families should complete the income eligibility form
  - Form asks to choose one of three options: Option A is free lunch, Option B is reduced lunch, Option C is do not qualify
- Parent and community support is needed to help everyone understand that Title 1 funds impact all students and are important for SUSD to keep consistent services
