Q & A with Dr. Menzel, SUSD Superintendent – Dr. Menzel answered questions submitted in person for 15 minutes.

SUSD Social Workers, Shannon Cronn, Director of Support Services

- An overview of SUSD support services was given
- Social workers collaborate with teachers, counselors, and parents
- Students who need help are identified by self-report; friends, parents, or teachers asking for help; or through surveys such as SAEBRS, which is overseen by social workers
- SAEBRS is a screening tool and can be used to help identify students who need additional supports and students ONLY participate if their parents have opted them in
- Social workers help implement comprehensive support system, which is a tiered model
 - Tier 1 is universal instruction e.g., all teachers teach behavior expectations
 - Social workers help implement PBIS and school-wide behavior policies (e.g., soccer on the playground)
 - Tier 2 is more than what get in day-to-day classroom, they get small group instruction
 - alternative to suspension: e.g., Project Rewind, partnership with NotMyKid
 - Tier 3 is students who need individualized instruction or higher frequency
 - brief counseling 3-7 sessions to work on and identify a goal, remove barriers to accessing academics; do not provide therapy, but can make referrals
 - Risk and threat assessment
- Last year, on average SUSD elementary schools completed 5 risk assessments for suicidal ideation
- For middle school, it was 17 risk assessments for suicidal ideation on average
- Our high schools were at 29 on average
 - Students either self-referred, or a parent/teacher/friend came forward and said I am concerned
- Social workers can create a safety plan to help students

• Social workers are also part of school safety team, can create safety plans when students pose a threat to others

Committee updates - The Special Education committee is offering an IEP training on September 29.
